Trade Training Centre

We are now four weeks into the construction of our new Trade Training Centre facilities. Students and staff alike are to be commended on their positive and cooperative attitude in dealing with the associated daily disruptions such as classroom changes, power outages, reduced parking and demolition and drilling noise. School Improvement Project

Turf was cut from our agriculture farm facility and transported to the school where a team of helpers prepared the soil and laid out the turf over three days. Other projects taking place later in the year will include the fencing of the south hill to enable us to bring livestock back to the school, planting a bush tucker garden and painting Aboriginal murals on K block. TAS Report

2011 is set to be a fantastic year for the TAS Department at Muswellbrook High School. This term marks the much awaited commencement on the Trade Training Centre. The Trade Training Centre is part of the 'Australian Government's Education Revolution'. It will involve a significant upgrading of the Hospitality, Metals and Engineering and Agriculture facilities at the school. Whilst this does mean there will be limited use of practical facilities for the duration of construction, the final outcome will be well worth the wait. We will have industry standard facilities that will provide students with the opportunity to develop new skills we would otherwise be unable to achieve.

In addition to the Trade Training Centre we have recently secured a \$10,000 grant courtesy of Doyles Creek Mining Community Trust. This funding will be used to purchase some much needed equipment for the Timber area of TAS, with the biggest purchases set to include a sliding table saw and air filtration for our rooms. Along with the P&C funding we have been given this year, we will be able to fully cater for students enrolled in our VET Construction course that was established in 2010. We hope these initiatives assist in achieving the overall goal of improving the number of students completing their HSC and addressing skills shortages. We look forward to being able to share the progress of these projects with you in the coming months.

Next term will see the return of Mrs Flood and Mrs Parker as well as the arrival of Mr McLaren who will be filling the vacancy available due to the departure of Mrs Gal. Mr McLaren comes to Muswellbrook from Dubbo and brings with him 17 years of experience as a chef and has been teaching in Dubbo for the last 2 years.

With Swimming almost over, the Cross Country and Athletics carnivals are quickly approaching and the Cross Country carnival will be held on Wednesday 30th March at Weeraman Field. All students from years 7-12 will be involved on the day from 1:00pm until 3:30pm.

Year 10 PDHPE students will shortly begin constructing their dance routines for the annual year 10 dance assessment. We are looking forward to late Term 2 when students will present their compositions in front of Years 9 and 10, parents and teachers. All Year 10 parents will be invited to attend this event and details will be provided in the future.

Outward Bound will also occur in Term 2 and preparations have started for this already. The venue is to be confirmed shortly and students are sure to have an exciting adventure.

Our Year 7 Thursday sporting competitions are in full swing with participation and enthusiasm improving each week. A score update will be provided at the end of the Semester and all house groups are battling to earn the title of Semester 1 champions. So far, the Boys groups have competed in a Soccer tournament and have just started their Oztag sport, whilst the Girls groups have competed in Basketball and are now constructing Dances during their sport afternoons.

A reminder to parents and students that all students are expected to bring and change into their full sports uniform consisting of **yellow polo shirt, navy shorts/track pants and appropriate joggers** for both PDHPE practical classes as well as sport afternoons. Students are allowed to drop off their shoes in the morning at the PDHPE staffroom until they have sport/practical classes and may pick up their shoes at the end of the day.
