We can work as a team to ensure a better outcome for everyone involved in your child's education by:


- 1. Log into the Parent Portal.

- 4. Make a note of your child's teachers and keep asking how their learning is going. Create a conversation around learning.



2014 proved to be a successful year from an Administration perspective at Muswellbrook High School. Our Attendance Team worked tirelessly to maximise student participation in all aspects of their schooling through the refinement of a number of initiatives and implementation of some new strategies. This led to a positive approach from staff and students, resulting in a 2.2% increase in the whole school attendance return for the year.

I must acknowledge the generosity from the Newcastle Knights, Majestic Cinemas in Singleton and our School Executive in supporting the ongoing Attendance Rewards initiative. Donations of ticketing to NRL matches, discounted movies and iTunes vouchers were incentives that our students strived to achieve by enhancing their approach to schooling. We also observed a positive atmosphere at our Swimming and Athletics Carnivals with FREE reward BBQs for attending students of the year group with the least absences on the day.

In writing my report to the Newcastle Knights, together with a request for tickets in 2015, it was pleasing to acknowledge that in 2013, Muswellbrook High School had 13 students with a yearly attendance over 98%. This number increased to 32 in 2014, with 16 students above 99% and Curtis Milich of Year 7 and Liam Barnes of Year 8, achieving the incredible attendance of 100%. This data is based on ALL attendance for the schooling year and includes partials, late arrivals and truancy. These boys and their thirty peers with this impressive attendance contributed significantly to our whole school result.

Truancy has been addressed in the school's Attendance Plan and Policy, with slight adjustments from the Attendance Team in Semester Two. Every lesson has it's roll marked on Millennium and daily, this data is reviewed to identify any student who is present at school, but marked absent in a lesson. These students are issued a slip to report to E-Block to explain their absence and, on most occasions, a clerical error, minor variation or student issue accounts for the data. Where a student is identified as truanting, our three step behaviour adjustment program is initiated. The first truancy results in the student receiving a detention in EO2 at lunch, a green Attendance Monitoring Card and an SMS to parent/carer. The second occasion follows the same procedure, however, a day in the Timeout Room for reflective and restorative justice is conducted. If a student truants for a third time, a two day suspension is issued, requiring a re-entry interview with a Deputy Principal for the student and parent/carer. Like the positive strategy outlined above, the results of this proactive truancy approach have seen a reduction in ongoing truancy for students.

Upon reflection on Term Four, I have observed a concerning trend with a number of students. Habitual late arrival is an area that will be addressed in 2015. I have been in contact with a number of Hunter area schools to consider strategies to modify the behaviour of parents and their children who arrive after 9am more often than arriving on time. Detentions, Attendance Monitoring Cards and referrals to the Home School Liaison Officer have occurred in some occasions, however, a program most suited to our school will be initiated. Perhaps the discussions should be made early in this term with your children about arranging a suitable wake up time in the morning, altering the school drop off (remembering that high school starts before primary school) or working out ways to improve the morning routine by having uniform, lunches or bathing completed the night before, can help make punctual attendance a priority and develop effective life habits.

As we look ahead to this year, Muswellbrook High School is embarking on an exciting stage by entering the Social Media world on Facebook. As a contributor to the "official" page, it has led to a reflective view on how we should be utilising this technology in both the classroom and community. If you have a Facebook profile, we recommend joining our community by "liking" our page. We encourage you to actively participate in our feed by "liking" photos or comments, but remind you of our Rules of Engagement when sharing your views. Everything we include on Facebook is promoting the great things that happen in and out of the classroom involving our students. If there are items that concern you, or questions you would like answered, the best forum is through phone contact to the school, so the most suitable person to respond can provide the most accurate answer. We do look forward to further interactions and sharing many experiences of our students in the future.

I hope you have had a fantastic Christmas, New Year and summer break and have rested and relaxed as much as possible, returning to school happy, healthy and hopeful of an even greater 2015. Make it a year to improve YOUR attendance.

Life Saving Program

In 2014 we built upon the foundations of the many years of Life Saving for students in Years 8-10. For three days in Term Four, Week Eight, Muswellbrook Aquatic Centre was inundated with an array of pupils enhancing their capacity to stay safe in the water, recognise dangers and act on situations where a person may need assistance.

The program commenced in Week Two, with fifteen Year 10 students developing their skills as Junior Instructors each Wednesday as part of their weekly sport. Most of these students acquired a Bronze Star, Medallion or Cross in previous years and demonstrated the requirements to manage their own group of participants during the few days at the pool.

Mr Elliott took charge of the CPR this year and students were captivated by the Bondi Rescue situation where a surfer became unconscious and required resuscitation. Miss McGrath delivered an informative session on surf safety, together with inland waterways to ensure students became equipped with the knowledge to avoid dangerous situations, particularly leading into summer. However, it was Mr Holdsworth who had every group on Wednesday listening intently to the messages about sun safety and the dangers of skin cancer throughout a life time. Sharing personal stories and seeing real life examples from the Hunter Melanoma Foundation resonated closely with students and resulted in tubs of sun cream being on high demand and a significant increase of participation on all three days of the program.

While Life Saving is run in conjunction with the Year 7 Development Days and Year 11 Crossroads, the skills that can be developed are very important and can potentially save a student, their friend or family member from drowning. Participants do not need to be amazing swimmers as the program offers a dry rescue option in the classroom, where students do not enter the water. The learn to swim option, in conjunction with the Swim and Survive Levels 2 and 3 is very popular with students who are willing to enhance their ability in the water, while developing some life saving techniques. The Swim and Survive Levels 4-7 were an ideal starting point for many Year 8 students who can swim to a sound standard, while some more advanced life preservation and saving skills are attained.

This year we had 30 students complete their Bronze Star, Medallion or Cross awards. These are the highest level of life saving awards available to school students and require an exceptional capacity to swim over an extended time with recognised strokes as well as complete a rescue of one or two casualties who could be identified as weak, non or injured swimmers, unconscious or have a potential spinal injury. The efforts of these students must be celebrated and will be acknowledged early in Term One, 2015 on assembly.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the Muswellbrook Aquatic Centre, Muswellbrook Girl Guides, the Muswellbrook Tennis Club and the Muswellbrook Amateur Swimming Club for their continued support of this program by the way of equipment and facilities over the three days. We do hope this experience for our students can increase and extend our ongoing relationship with these organisations. Royal Life Saving Society Australia's Hunter Manager, Tanya Brunkhorst was very impressed with how effective the program was, when she visited on Friday morning and she hopes that Muswellbrook High School can continue to be leaders in delivering life saving to such a broad array of students.


Dear Parents

BUS ROUTE CHANGE TO 122 AM & 111 PM AROUND EASTLINKS ESTATE

Currently your child is catching the 122 bus in the morning and the 111 bus in the afternoon from Muswellbrook High School to the Corner of Henry Dangar Drive and Wanaruah Circuit.

As of Monday 16 February 2015 we will be changing our bus routes. Your children will remain on the same bus 122 in the morning and 111 in the afternoon however instead of going around Wanaruah Circuit the bus will now be going Up Henry Dangar Drive, Left into Dixon Circuit and following this back to Henry Dangar Drive to turn right and return back towards the school.

At this stage we will be keeping the pick up and drop off times the same. Stops will be at the following places (as per picture):



Why do we need restricted parking?

- Restricted parking in school zones is there for the safety of our children.
- It is designed to help all road users maintain safe lines of vision.
- It is designed to allow for a turnover of vehicles within a limited area.
- Illegal parking creates a dangerous environment for children as it can severely reduce their view of approaching vehicles.

Know your Parking Signs

NO STOPPING



What does it mean? You cannot stop in this area FOR ANY REASON.

Why is it there?

To keep line of sight clear for drivers AND children, so both have more time to avoid crashes.

NO PARKING



What does it mean? You can stop in a NO

You can stop in a NO PARKING zone for a maximum of two minutes to drop off or pick up passengers. You must stay within three (3) metres of your car at all times.

Why is it there?

To provide a safe place for older children to be set down and picked up without endangering other children.

BUS ZONE



What does it mean? You must not stop or

park in a bus zone unless you are driving a bus.

Why is it there? To provide safe place for buses to set down and pick up passengers.

Cars parking in bus zones put lives at risk by forcing buses out of "their" safety zone.


