## Biology and Senior Science Fieldwork

Year 11 and 12 Senior Science and Biology classes made the annual pilgrimage to the Redhill Environmental Education Centre at Gulgong in Week 2 to complete their mandatory fieldwork.

Our first day was spent collecting biotic and abiotic field data from the ecosystem at Munghorn Gap, on the boundary of the Great Dividing Range. The team at Redhill lead the students through a variety of activities, efficiently and effectively, and beyond the scope of what can be offered at school.

On the second day students completed their water testing and those more adventurous went further into the unknown, downstream to find the spectacular but peaceful settings along the Goulburn River.

We stopped to admire the basalt columns at Battery Rock on the way out and Wiradjeri art "Hands on Rock" near the Drip Gorge on our way home.

This overnight excursion is a highlight of the school year because of the fantastic experiences we have principally at the Drip Gorge. The students were excellent ambassadors for the school and we remain welcome and acknowledged as one of a few high schools that take full advantage of this opportunity. ## **News From Gold Class**

During the January holidays Mr Taylor prepared a plot at the school farm in preparation for the GOLD class vegetable garden. I purchased an assortment of vegetable seedlings from Bunnings at Singleton. In term 1, GOLD started work on their vegetable garden. They divided the plot into different sections and selected where each vegetable would grow best. They planted several varieties of tomatoes, including Roma and cherry. They also planted spinach, silverbeet, beetroot, celery, capsicum, spring onions, lettuce, cabbage and rhubarb.











They visit and work on their plot every Tuesday during Community Access. Of course weeding is the main activity, along with staking and tying up tomatoes. Once the plants mature students are harvesting the vegetables. They also love collecting the eggs in the chook pen .

The vegetables have been growing wonderfully, especially with the great rain we had in March. We have used some of the produce in our cooking classes. The Spanakopitas were a big hit. The students were eating spinach and loving it. Students even took a couple for Ms Bate to taste. It won't be long till the cabbages, spring onions, rhubarb and tomatoes are ready. GOLD class have recipes ready to put those vegetables to good use.

## NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

This year the program has been adjusted.

In 2017 the following vaccines will be offered:

YEARS	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES	DATE
Year 7	Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine	2-doses in 2017 at least 6 months apart*	1 <sup>st</sup> dose 23/2
	Varicella vaccine (chickenpox) – catch-up	Single dose	23/2
	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine	Single dose	19/10
Years 11- Meningococcal ACWY vaccine		Single dose	11/5

\* The second dose of HPV vaccine is being delayed to later in the year (at least 6 months after the first dose) to allow the recently-announced Meningococcal ACWY Vaccination Program to be offered to students in Years 11 and 12 from Term 2 when the second dose of HPV vaccine is usually given. There is no harm for Year 7 students in delaying the second dose of HPV vaccine and further advice for parents will be provided later in the year regarding HPV course completion.

Parent Information Kits that included an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement were sent home to parents/guardians and should have been returned. If your child did not receive the consent form (Year 7 in February, Year 11 and 12 in May), please contact the school by phone.

Please note that students who commence HPV vaccination in school clinics in Year 7 but do not complete the course during the school year may be offered catch-up doses at school in Year 8. Students who have any HPV doses at their GP will be advised to complete the course with their GP.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at <a href="https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation">www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation</a>.

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic as a physical card. Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.



# Drive - Youth Driver Training

iDrive is tailor-made around each student's limitations during the day we steadily help them overcome them. The experiences and level of competency of a "p" Plate driver usually differ greatly in regard to the driver who just got their "L"; s three weeks ago. At the conclusion of training, drivers have been brought up to standard that will assist in greatly reducing the risk of them ever being involved in a preventable accident.

Drive focuses on prevention, planning and technique - NOT CURE!

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


