SPORT REPORT - HARRY SCOWEN

What a year it's been for Year 11's Harry Scowen!

Harry was highly decorated at our end of year Presentation Assembly, to recognise his incredible achievements within the sport of cricket. Unfortunately, Harry was unable to be present for the assembly as we was competing in the U19s National Cricket Challenge, so he was awarded at the final school assembly for the year.

Firstly, Harry trialled against the best school cricketers across the entire Hunter Region and was selected in the Hunter CHS boys cricket team. The next award he received recognised his selection further from this team, at NSW Representative Level, an amazing progression.

Harry was also selected as the recipient of the 2023 MHS Sporting Highest Achiever Award. This award is presented to a student who has successfully gained selection and represented at the highest level in their particular internal school pathway sport during the current school year. The recipient must also demonstrate leadership, dedication and sport, sportsmanship and respect. Over the past year, Harry has excelled in school cricket. He scored numerous halves and centuries in the school team, contributing to the success of the team. As previously mentioned he was selected to represent at region and state level, being recognised for his performance in the NSWCHSSA Opens Cricket Championship where he was selected out of over 120 players in the CHS 1st team, for his batting and wicket keeping ability. At his competition, he also received numerous awards, including the Hunter Team MVP, Steve Rixon Trophy for the best batsman of the championship (he was averaging 60 runs - previous recipients of this award include Australian cricket royalty Adam Gilchrist, Steven Smith and Phillip Hughes!). Harry also received the Alan Davidson Trophy for the best player of the championship, awarded based on a points system.

Furthermore, in Week 9 Harry was also being recognised at regional level, being awards a Region Sporting Blue Award, nominated and selected by the Hunter School Sport Association. This is a prestigious award that is not easily achieved and recognises students across the Hunter who excel in their chosen sport. This year, Harry was one of 28 students across every school in the Hunter Region, to achieve the Blue Award. He is clearly a highly deserving recipient of the 2023 MHS Sporting Highest Achiever Award.

Finally, Harry was also the recipient of the MHS 1953 Shield Team Extraordinary Achievement Award. This award recognises a senior student who has overcome adversity, of any kind, to achieve throughout their senior years. Attempting senior studies is a rigorous and challenging pursuit for any young person, let alone when combined with a dream of achieving at the highest level in your sport of choice. Harry is a student who epitomises all that it means to work diligently and tirelessly, making sacrifices to achieve his ambitions. A talented sportsman representing our school in not only cricket, but also touch and soccer, he has consistently shown resilience and dedication to both his education and his sport. He is driven and focussed and manages to juggle study, assessment tasks and working, with regular travel for training sessions and competition. He has accomplished all of these achievements listed in this notice, whilst maintaining his own academic success. His success is a true testament to the importance of setting yourself a goal and believing in your ability to work hard and achieve it.





LIFE SAVING 2024

Last year 281 people lost their lives to drowning in Australia. We are still not back to pre COVID numbers. Our annual 3 day lifesaving program aims to ensure that our students are not part of these tragic statistics in the future.

We are one of the longest running and largest programs in the Hunter Region, with over 200 students receiving Junior Lifesaving Awards, including many students (and staff) receiving the coveted Bronze Medallion Award.

This year we had 8 Year 10 students undergo the Instructor program during sport time across term 4, culminating in looking after a group during the lifesaving program.

Apart from the swimming part of the program, which for some students was a first, our program includes sessions on River/Beach safety, Sun safety and Resuscitation.

Whilst it's 3 relaxing days with your mates at the pool the big picture is one of improving student safety around the water for the summer months ahead.




